St Ambrose Kitchen Update

We made progress on the upgrade of the parish kitchen this past week. The cabinets were emptied in preparation for tear-out. Three replacement doors were ordered to replace the door in the kitchen and the two doors in the old gym area. Since the old doors were literally falling apart and there is a five to six week lead-time on the doors, they were ordered now. We have confirmed with the city inspectors the building codes for the triple sink and hand washing sink. Next steps are obtaining bids for plumbing and electrical. That also includes a bid for the exhaust system. The team appreciates your prayers to guide us as we select the contractors.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

1st Sunday of Lent

St. Oscar Romero said, "Aspire not to have more, but to be more." These powerful words provide the perfect framework for a conversion oriented Lenten experience. God is giving us this Lenten sign to stop being concerned about what you have and focus on who you are. This requires that we create a desert space and listen more attentively for God to reveal His presence. It is all so wonderfully simple on the one hand and so incredibly challenging on the other. The message is simple: love God, neighbor, and self. Those simple words make great sense, but we struggle translating them into reality. Our attachments, compulsions, obsessions, addictions, routines, and busyness all anchor us to the "idol of the self," keeping us mired in our compulsive need for self-aggrandizement. It's not about us!

God vowed, long ago, to nurture, sustain and protect the relationship He has with His people. He called us into being, nurtures us in being, and sustains us in being. Without the Loving Divine Presence, all life would cease. Once we slow down a bit and clear away some of the clutter, we can see how the journey of our life is unfolding. We can see what brings us in and out of tune with God's love and how we can better imitate God's loving fidelity in our relationship with Him. In short, we will see our myopic short sightedness and figure out how we can better share the Divine Fire within with others. Lent isn't just about giving stuff up for forty days and indulging again at Easter. We need to push things much farther and wrestle with the question of how we can be more. "Being more" means becoming more fully alive and in touch with the holiness of life and the divinity that lives in and empowers all beings and things. It is realizing that the "quality" of our presence is crucial to being an effective witness and herald of God's unconditional love.

The illusion we have bought into causes us to believe that the wrong things and systems matter. We tirelessly fight to keep things the way they are, to return to the former ways of doing things or restore some nostalgic fantasy memory of "life in the good old days." Lent isn't about maintaining what we have or returning to something that is gone. It's about becoming something new. It's about being more focused, centered, convicted, and grounded so that we can be a person who truly loves and treasures being made in the image of God. The secret to Gospel living is not found in accumulating anything for ourselves, even merit points for heaven. Gospel living means learning how to live with less so that others can live with more. The thought of permanently giving something up makes us feel uncomfortable. Truth often does.

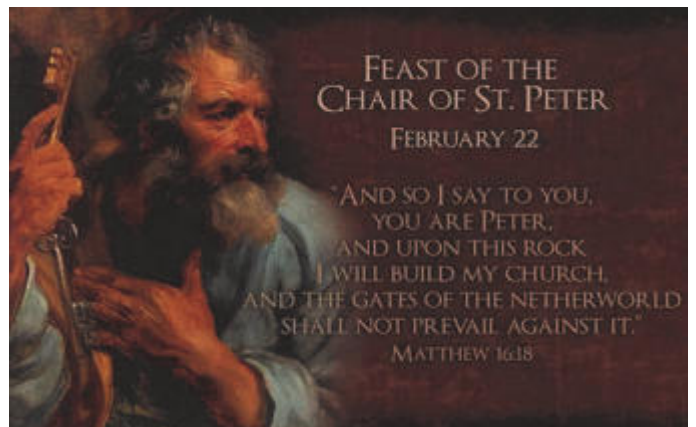

Guidelines for Reverent Reception of the Eucharist in Cars

Please note receiving Holy Communion in your car is a temporary allowance in the local Diocese of Peoria due to concerns regarding the Covid19 virus. As long as the pandemic persists, the faithful are permitted to receive Holy Communion in this extra-ordinary manner (outside of the normal) if they are uncomfortable or incapable of attending Mass in the church due to the prohibition against gatherings in excess of 25% of a building's capacity.

~ Reception of communion should be preceded by "virtual attendance" at Mass, either by listening on the radio or watching on our facebook stream. During normal times, one is not permitted to enter the church just at communion time, receive communion, and leave immediately after.

~ While waiting in line for communion, a sense of reverence should be maintained, just as one would aim to do during the communion rite of the Mass. If music is played on the radio, you might listen in silence, perhaps pray the Rosary or other prayers, or just reflect meditatively on what you are about to receive.

~ It is advised not to be talking to others before receiving, spending time on an electronic device, listening to secular music or a radio station, listening/watching athletic events, etc. As a general rule of thumb, if you wouldn't do something in the church before receiving communion, it probably shouldn't be done in your car.

~ We are prohibited from eating anything for one hour prior to receiving communion. The one hour fast should be maintained when receiving communion in the car, so eating in one's car during Mass should be avoided. Likewise, nothing should be in our mouths when receiving communion. This especially includes chewing gum. The Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Jesus and He shouldn't have to share one's mouth with another object. Parts of the host can also get stuck in gum which might then ultimately be spit out on the ground or into a trash-can.

~ Please come to a complete stop when receiving communion and put your car in park.

~ After receiving the host, please place it in your mouth and consume immediately, prior to driving away. Given the gravity of what the Eucharist is (God sharing His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity with us!!), we shouldn't have the host in our hand while also steering the car with the same hand. Simply place the host in your mouth and then drive away.

~ After receiving communion it is advisable to spend at least a few moments in prayerful Thanksgiving and reflection. You might consider pulling back into the parking lot and spending a few minutes in silence or driving home in silence, reflecting on the mystery of the Eucharist. Whether receiving communion in the church or in the car, it can be easy to forget the grandeur of the Blessed Sacrament. Deliberately doing things to remind ourselves of the significance of Holy Communion helps us grow in gratitude and love of Our Lord!
